11th grade





he eighth grade students also visited the trees they planted at the beginning of the year. Many of them were pleasantly surprised to see their development.

Lisbeth Ruíz tells us a little about her experience: "The plant is bigger compared to last time, it has no flowers, but its leaves and stem are bigger, healthier and with a beautiful green color".

Sofia Ruíz also told us that, "the tree is bigger compared to the time it was planted, the leaves are green, some with a slightly yellowish tone, the stem is thicker at the base. From the top of the plant, a single flower with yellow



base and red petals can be seen and the pistils of the flower still have some pollen. The sun does not hit it directly so the tree is not burned, and the periods of rain that have occurred at the school have kept it with nutrients and food."

Joaquín, noted that in this second check-up he did on his tree, he observed that compared to the last time he checked it, it has grown, has more leaves and has adapted very well to the area. It may need more care, but it is still healthy.

Some plants have not shown great changes as is the case of *Mariana* and *Laura's* tree, they told us that: the tree grew a little, it has two flowers and also new buds but some branches fell off, it has few leaves and has no weeds around it, nor leaves, we consider that it lacks water because some branches and leaves fell off since the last time we saw it, we believe that a solution for this is to give it more water and fertilizer so that in the future it will be a more beautiful flower than it is already.

Another report was presented to us by **Victoria** and **Danna:** "As soon as



we arrived we recognized our tree, although it had lost its name we could see at a glance that it was bigger and that many of its leaves had fallen off. Some of the leaves had a reddish tone but most of them were green, and there were also a lot of weeds, so we removed them very carefully, since we did not want to hurt the tree".

We can conclude from this visit that the trees are bigger, less leafy and had a lot of weeds, but, in general they were in good condition because, nature is so perfect that it does not need anyone to survive apart from itself, but this does not mean that we can not do anything for it because we can recycle, plant trees, do not pull up plants, etc

And we can do this not only with our trees but with nature in general and with a small act we can generate a big change.
